

MR. JUSTICE STEWART delivered the opinion of the Court.

The Import-Export Clause of the Constitution, Art. I, § 10, cl. 2, provides:

"No State shall, without the Consent of the Congress, lay any Imposts or Duties on Imports or Exports, except what may be necessary for executing its inspection laws; and the net Produce of all Duties and Imposts, laid by any State on Imports and Exports, shall be for the Use of the Treasury of the United States; and all such laws shall be subject to the Revision and Controul of the Congress."

The issue for decision in this case is whether the assessment of an ad valorem personal property tax by the petitioner Tax Commissioner of Ohio upon certain property of the respondent is in conflict with this Clause.

I

The respondent National Cash Register Company (NCR) has for many years engaged in the manufacture of cash registers, accounting machines, and electronic data processing systems, which it markets worldwide. Its
