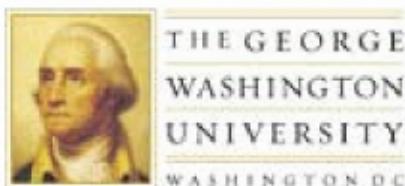

We are all hardened to the nonsense peddled as "inside information" by some reporters, and with our "vows of silence" there is nothing we can do about it. All of us know that from the day of our Conference on July 10 we were in accord on every major point and that our only differences (and few they were) related to semantics and detail, not substance. I write this to record the fact of our initial and sustained unanimity, as to which there was at no time any doubt, once all the arguments were in, and to keep you posted on the antics of the media in your absence.
