PER CURIAM.

When appellant failed to pay 1961 real estate taxes pertaining to her one-quarter interest in the oil and gas in 68 acres of land in Kanawha County, W. Va., the interest became subject to transfer to the State under West Virginia statutory procedures that afford notice to the landowner only through the posting of a delinquency list on the county courthouse door and the publication of the list in local newspapers. W. Va. Code §§ 11A-2-10, 11A-3-2. The interest was sold to the State under these procedures in 1962. W. Va. Code § 11A-3-8, gave appellant a statutory entitlement to redeem the interest at any time within 18 months of the date of the state purchase but appellant did not redeem during that period. The State thereafter decided to sell the interest and, as required by West Virginia law, commenced a suit in State Circuit Court to effect a sale. The suit resulted in the conveyance in 1966, by tax deed, of the oil and gas interest to appellee W. P. Dodd. The only notice of this sale was by way of publication in two local newspapers, pursuant to § 11A-4-12. Over two years later, in July 1968, appellant attempted to pay the State Auditor a sum of money to redeem the interest. The payment was refused on the ground that she no longer owned the oil and gas interest. Appellant then brought this action in state court to quiet title. The Circuit Court rendered judgment


