MEMORANDUM TO THE CONFERENCE

A-745, Wainwright v. Greenfield - 84-1480

At Greenfield's trial, evidence of his post-arrest request for a lawyer and subsequent silence was introduced by the state to rebut his insanity defense. The jury found Greenfield guilty, and his conviction was affirmed by the Florida Supreme Court.

The DC for the M.D. of Fla. denied Greenfield's habeas petition. CALL reversed, holding that evidence of Greenfield's post-arrest silence was inadmissible, even for the limited purpose of showing that petitioner was sane at the time he committed the crime. Because Miranda warnings had been given, CALL reasoned that the use of petitioner's post-arrest silence violated the Due Process Clause of the Fourteenth Amendment, as interpreted in Doyle v. Ohio, 426 U.S. 610 (1976). CALL ordered that petitioner be retried within a reasonable time, which the DC determined on remand to be 120 days.

The 120-day period will expire on June 13, 1985. On April 3, 1985, in my capacity as Circuit Justice, I entered a stay of CALL's judgment. CALL's decision is in clear conflict with a decision from CA7, Sulie v. Duckworth, 689 F.2d 128 (1982), and arguably in conflict with a CA10 decision. As the issue also is important, I thought it likely that the Court would grant cert., thereby deferring a retrial until we have acted. The stay order provided that it would remain in effect "pending ... further order of the undersigned or of the Court."

Greenfield's cert. petition has been placed on the list for the May 9 Conference. If the Court decides to hear the case, its order granting cert. will automatically lift the stay and compel a second trial. In order to prevent what may be an unnecessary retrial, I have entered a second stay, that will automatically expire if cert is denied.
